THE INSTRUCTIONS CONTAINED IN CIRCULAR O/R.R. DATED DECEMBER, 1950, UNDER THE HEADING "INSTRUCTIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN CONNECTION WITH THE WORKING OF TRAINS DESIGNATED BY THE CODE WORD "GROVE" MUST BE APPLIED TO THE TRAINS IN THIS NOTICE WHICH ARE MARKED "GROVE."

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS. ALL SHUNTING AT STATIONS AND YARDS EN ROUTE MUST BE STOPPED WHILST THE ROYAL TRAIN IS PASSING. ALL TRAINS PASSING THE ROYAL SPECIAL MUST REDUCE SPEED TO 15 MILES PER HOUR WHILST SO DOING. AS FAR AS POSSIBLE THE PUBLIC MUST BE EXCLUDED FROM THE STATIONS EN ROUTE, AND EVERY EFFORT MUST BE MADE TO SECURE QUIETNESS WHILST THE ROYAL TRAIN IS PASSING.

THE ARRANGEMENTS AS REGARD TIMES, ETC., OF THE ROYAL SPECIAL MUST BE KEPT STRICTLY PRIVATE AND MUST NOT BE COMMUNICATED TO ANY OF THE PUBLIC WHATEVER.

General Notes

(i) Stopping points

At the undermentioned places the "GROVE" train must be brought to a stand with the centre of the engine cab opposite a point at which a Hand Signalman will be stationed to indicate the place at which the train must stop. In cases where the train is double-headed the train should come to a stand with the centre of the cab of the leading engine opposite to the Hand Signalman:—

(ii) Working of Automatic Brake

At the undermentioned places when the train engine has been coupled to the train and the brake tested by the Guard, or, after the train has come to a stand, the automatic brake must be entirely destroyed and the brake held on the train until the Driver receives instructions from the Station Master or Officer in charge of the train to re-create the brake:—
