Speed must not exceed 14 miles per hour.

Train must carry white headlights and a red tail lamp, and the Driver must have with him on the machine two red flags. not less than 12 detonators, and a sprag. A portable telephone must also be provided on the machine.

The trailer associated with the tamping machine must be drawn, and two men must travel in it, one of whom must have with him a complete set of flags, a hand lamp and not less than 12 detonators.

The Driver will be responsible for seeing that the trailer is properly coupled before the journey is commenced, and he must look back frequently during the journey to see that the trailer is following.

Before the trailer is uncoupled it must be properly secured.

The machine must be kept in gear when running down gradients, and when running out of gear every care must be taken to keep the vehicle under complete control.

The Driver must observe fixed signals and must not pass a stop signal at danger unless authorised to do so by the Signalman. After being authorised to pass a stop signal at danger, the Driver will be held responsible for seeing that any points are in the proper position and he must proceed with caution so far as the line is clear only.

The machine cannot be relied upon to actuate track circuits, and the provision of Rule 55 must be observed by the man proceeding to the signal box for this purpose.

Should the train be delayed whilst waiting acceptance by the box in advance, it must not be allowed to draw forward to the signal controlling the entrance to the section ahead, but must be held at the home signal or brought to a stand at a point opposite the box.

Public level crossings not protected by fixed signals and occupation crossings must be approached with caution.

Should the machine require to run through automatically signalled areas, colour light areas or intermediate block sections, the machine must be protected in accordance with Rule 215.

When the machine requires to run on the single line, the Driver must be in possession of a token or train staff.

Should the train be delayed whilst waiting acceptance by the box in advance, it must not be allowed to draw forward to the signal controlling the entrance to the section ahead, but must be held at the home signal or brought to a stand at a point opposite the box.

Public level crossings not protected by fixed signals and occupation crossings must be approached with caution.

Should the machine require to run through automatically signalled areas, colour light areas or intermediate block sections, the machine must be protected in accordance with Rule 215.

When the machine requires to run on the single line, the Driver must be in possession of a token or train staff.

Vacuum-fitted engines and carriages must be provided to work on the special trains shown to be run for the conveyance of workmen in connection with Fermanent Way or other Engineering operations. In some cases where a freight brake van is shown to be provided in addition to the carriages such brake van must be marshalled on the rear of the carriages in order that the Automatic Brake may be worked between the engine and the carriages.
